

## PEP Insights Research Covid-19 UK timeline (March 2020 - April 2021)

This timeline captures a flavour of the UK government's key announcements relating to restrictions brought about by the Coronavirus pandemic, with specific references to lockdown restrictions, HE and school closures, and vaccine development and roll out, alongside dates relating to the PEP Insights Research design and data gathering. Whilst the list is not comprehensive, it provides useful context for the research.
